The Linesperson realizes that an icing has been missed when Team A shot the puck down the ice and team B scored because of the no-call. The linesperson reports the icing to the Referee who disallows the goal. True or False, the next face-off goes at center ice due to liners' error (Hockey Canada 5.3d, Situation 7).

Correct

- a) True.
- b) False. Treat this as though the icing was called correctly and take the next face-off at the appropriate dot in Team A's zone.



A10 clearly checks B2 from behind. The referee (in the 3-official system) misses the check and call. The Linesperson, clearly sees the call...may the Linesperson make the call? (Situation 8, Rule 5.3d)

Correct

- A) yes, always.
- B) yes, but only If both Linespeople see and agree on the call
- C) Maybe. A Linesperson may never call a 2 + GM for CFB (but may call a 5 + GM or Match)
- D) No. A Linesperson may never call a CFB regardless of 2 + GM, 5 + GM, or Match.



It is a 2-1 game, A6 has a breakaway with 5 seconds left and is fouled from behind (meeting all criteria for a penalty shot) with the next stoppage happening at 0:00 horn. What should the referee call? (HC Rule 4.9j, situation 2 #5)

Correct

- a) Nothing if this is the end of the game, a penalty shot if this is the end of the first or second.
- b) A penalty shot because it is a 1 goal

game, nothing if it is a 2 goal or more lead.

- c) A penalty shot must be awarded regardless of whether this is the end of the first, second, third, or overtime period.
- d) Nothing regardless of which period this is.



The coach is yelling at the referee, who decides to call a bench minor penalty. Which option best describes the referee's next actions? (HC 4.13 a & b)

Correct

- a) The referee must call a game misconduct not a bench minor.
- b) do not raise her arm for a delayed penalty, wait for the next natural stoppage and assess a penalty then.
- c) stop play immediately regardless of who has possession and call the penalty.
- d) the referee will put a penalty on delay by raising her arm and stop play when the offending team gains possession of the puck.



A goal is scored. However, the back of the net is lifted as the puck crosses the goal line. Is the goal allowed? (HC Rule 10.4, Situation 12)

Correct

- a) Yes, always
- b) No, the goal is considered off its position and play should be stopped.
- c) Yes, if the net remains on its moorings.



Blue 6 receives 5+GM at 4:04, Blue 9 is given 2 minutes at 3:34, White 11 gets 2 minutes at 3:04. White Scores at 2:34. Who comes out of the box? (Rule 4.2b, Situation 11)

Correct

- Blue 6
- Whoever is serving for Blue 6
- Blue 9
- No one.
- White 11



What penalty is assessed to a player or team official who engages in insults or

verbal taunts based on race, ethnicity, religion, gender, sexual orientation or language? (Rule 11.4)

Correct

- a) Game Misconduct
- b) Major and Game Misconduct
- c) Match
- d) Gross Misconduct
- e) Referee's choice



Icing Ruling: The puck is shot by a player behind her blue line. A potential icing is signaled by the back official. An opposing team player is within 10 feet of her players' bench and her substitute comes onto the ice as the puck passes within reach of these two players. Playing the puck would constitute a Bench Minor penalty for too many players. The opposing players make no attempt to play the puck in this situation, with the puck continuing on down over the goal line. Is icing called or is it waved off because the opposing player could have played the puck? (rule 10.5 Situation 16)

Correct

- Icing. The player making the change is not required to play the puck
- No Icing. The team shooting the puck should not be penalized due to a line change.
- In this case, the player changing may play the puck and not receive a penalty.



Face-off placement: Team A has the puck in their zone and Team B has a delayed offside. Team A ices the puck. Where does the face-off go? (10.2 Situation 9)

Correct

- Outside of Team A's end as though the offside was blown down.
- Inside team A's end as is the case for all other icings.
- At Center Ice



Under what circumstances does a center ice face off take place? Select all that apply (Rule 10.2 h)

Correct

- a) If the puck is shot out of play from

a) if the puck is shot out of play from center ice.

b) at the start of each period ✓

c) if an offside pass originates at center ice

d) after a goal ✓

e) premature substitution of the goaltender ✓

f) if a group of players "freeze" the puck along the center red line

g) Error on calling an icing ✓

h) Error on an offside call
