(OPTIONAL) What is your email?

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**It is a 2-1 game, A6 has a breakaway with 5 seconds left and is fouled from behind (meeting all criteria for a penalty shot) with the next stoppage happening at 0:00 horn. What should the referee call? (HC Rule 4.9j, situation 2 #5)**

- ☐ a) Nothing if this is the end of the game, a penalty shot if this is the end of the first or second.
- ☐ b) A penalty shot because it is a 1 goal game, nothing if it is a 2 goal or more lead.

**The coach is yelling at the referee, who decides to call a bench minor penalty. Which option best describes the referee's next actions? (HC 4.13 a & b)**

- ☐ b) do not raise her arm for a delayed penalty, wait for the next natural stoppage and assess a penalty then.
- ☐ c) stop play immediately regardless of who has possession and call the penalty.

**At the 6:00 mark, A3 is assessed 2+2. At the 5:00 mark, B7 scores, but before play resumes B8 is assessed a Minor penalty. Are the Minor penalties to A3 and B8 considered coincidental or do they play 4 on 4 with two minutes showing on each team's penalty time clock? (Rule 4.2 Situation 20)**

**M.O.T.O is used to cancel coincidental penalties. What does the "T" of M.O.T.O stand for and when is M.O.T.O. used? (Rule 4.4b Situation 1; Rule 4.2b Situation 2)**

- ☒ T = Avoid TAKING an extra player off the ice 
- ☐ T = make the TEAM only one player short.
- ☐ T = TOTAL sum of penalties is equal unless penalties don't cancel.
- ☐ T = The team playing short receives a TIME penalties.

**True or false. The faceoff following an icing (in a normal situation where a penalty has not been called) takes place in the offending team's zone on the side of the ice the puck crossed the goal line (Rule 10.5a, Situation 12)**

- ☐ True. The face location is determined by the side of the ice that the puck crosses the goal line.
- ☒ False. The faceoff takes place at the offending team's faceoff dot on the side of the ice from which the shot initiated.



**Team A chooses to play without a goalie. However, a skater (who is not designated as a goalie) chooses to stand in front of the net. Team B shoots the puck from team B's side of the ice meeting criteria for icing. Is it icing given the team A skater standing in the crease? (HC Rule 10.5d)**

Correct

- ☐ It is icing so long as the player does not leave the crease.
- ☒ Depends: It is not icing if the official determines that the team A player (who has no goalie privileges) guarding the goal could reach the puck before the puck crosses the goal line.
- ☐ It is never icing as the team A player can always get to the puck.
- ☐ It is icing as the player is considered a goal for the purpose of icing only but in no other way.



**At a stoppage of play, A14 pushes B87 who then pushes back. What penalties should be assessed? (HC Situation 2 Rule 6.7)**

- ☒ Assess only A14 a penalty for "Roughing after the whistle." (Team A kills a penalty)
- ☐ Assess only B87 a penalty for "Roughing after the whistle." (Team B kills a penalty)
- ☐ Assess both players a penalty for "Roughing after the whistle." (No one kills a penalty)
- ☐ Tell both players to stop, so long as neither continues then there is no penalty.



**B10 leaves the penalty bench before her penalty is over, due to timekeeper's error, and checks A3 who has a breakaway in the neutral or attacking zone. What actions or penalties (if any) should the referee assess? (HC Situation 1 Rule 9.5 d & e)**

Correct

- ☐ Play would be stopped and player illegally on the ice would be returned to penalty bench to serve remaining time.

☐ Play would be stopped, a penalty shot assessed, the player illegally on the ice would return to serve remainder of penalty if a goal was not scored on the penalty shot.

☒ Play would be stopped, a penalty shot assessed, the player illegally on the ice would return to serve remainder of penalty regardless of whether a goal is scored on the penalty shot.



☐ Play is allowed to continue and the player illegally on the ice is returned to the penalty bench at the next stoppage.

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
